**HURRICANE SEASON/PREPARATION:** June 1 through November 30. In San Remo, you are in **Flood ZONE A** see website: <https://www.floridadisaster.org/planprepare/>

**CRIME PREVENTION:** Keep outside lighting & dock lights on at night. Keep exterior doors and vehicles locked.

**BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR:** If you see something, say something – notify Sheriff of any unusual activity

**VEHICLE SPEED LIMIT:** 20 MPH in the subdivision

**WALK / RUN:** On LEFT facing traffic – wear light colors or reflective gear and/or carry a flashlight in low-light conditions

**CYCLE:** Ride RIGHT with flow of traffic. A bell is needed as a warning device. Working front white light and back blinking red light is required for low-light conditions. Light or reflective clothing is suggested.

**HOUSE ALARM SYSTEMS:** The Manatee Sheriff allows two false alarms – after which the county will charge

### **WE LOVE OUR PETS:**

**Clean up:** The Manatee ordinance requires pet owners to remove pet waste deposited by their animal from any public or private property.

**Noise Nuisance/Dogs or Cats:** No dog or cat shall disturb the peace and quiet or interfere with the enjoyment of life with persistent objectionable noises of barking, whining, howling etc. for a persistent period of time exceeding (10) ten minutes.

**HELPFUL TO KNOW NEIGHBORHOOD INFORMATION:****NOISE LEVELS IN SAN REMO SHORES:**

The county rule is NO LOUD NOISE i.e. music, voices, partying etc. **before 7 AM or after 10 PM**

**GARBAGE & RECYCLING:**

**Mondays and Thursdays: Trash** - Garbage must be placed in tied bags and should not be loose in garbage containers weighing no more than 50 lbs. each.

**Mondays Recycling pickup:** - Place blue recycling container at curb (non-recycled items pictured on lid)

**Wednesdays Yard Waste:** Must be in sturdy garbage bags, put into garbage cans or bundled no longer than 4 feet in length.

**LOCAL RECREATION:****WATERCRAFT: ALL SURROUNDING SYSTEMS OF CANALS ARE A “NO WAKE” SPEED ZONE**

NO WAKE means coming completely off plane and traveling at or near idle speed. The V-shape wave should not exist or be so small as not to reach the seawall or other watercraft. Apply this low speed when you enter a “no-wake zone” or any area where your wake could compromise the safety of people, other boats or property—SLOW DOWN!!!

**BOATING:** Florida requires any one born after January 1, 1988 to have a Boating Safety Education ID Card to operate a motorized vessel of 10 horsepower or greater.

**Boating Safety Equipment:**

Coast Guard requires safety equipment including life jackets (PDF) for every person onboard, life sling or throwable flotation, horn or sound producing device, fire extinguisher, flares and visual distress signals. Federal Regulations mandate that child life jacket laws require that youths under 13 wear an approved PFD (correct size to fit child) whenever a recreational boat is underway, unless below decks or in a closed cabin.

Boating in Low Light or Fog Requires Lights: Powerboats under 12 meters (39.4 feet) in length must have separate or combined red and green sidelights visible for 1 nautical mile. The white masthead light must be 1 meter above the sidelights and be visible for 2 nautical miles.

**FISHING:**

**Fishing Licenses:** All individuals 16 years or older are required to have a recreational license for fishing on land, dock or boat. Purchase at GoOutdoorsFlorida.com, Dick’s Sporting Goods. Download free: Fish/Hunt FL mobile App. Must have license even if you cast a line or catch and release.

If fishing off the seawalls please do NOT leave rods unattended or reel up when you see a boat coming down the canal. Damage to boats passing by can be extensive.

**Exempt from Fishing License:** those under 16 years of age, resident Seniors 65 years or older, Florida residents who are members of Armed Forces, Florida residents certified as totally or permanently disabled

**Manatees and Dolphins:** There is a heavy fine for feeding, chasing or molesting manatees or dolphins. You must stay 50 feet away from dolphins and manatees and may not actively chase them.

**Navigating Local Waters:** Follow the Navigational Markers – Red (triangles) and Green (squares) to get to and from the bays, Intracoastal Waterway and Gulf of Mexico. The water in surrounding areas is low in depth, stay in the marked channels and check your depth gauge frequently.

### **BEACHES:**

Some of the rules on the beaches of Anna Maria Island: NO: glass, alcohol, pets (except service animals), bicycles, fires, grills, golf carts, vehicles, fireworks. Leave the wildlife undisturbed.

Summer is stingray season, which means it's time to do the stingray **shuffle** (shuffle your feet flat on bottom when entering water). The barbs in their whip-like tails are painful if an unsuspecting beachgoer kicks or steps on one.

Sea Turtle nesting season is May 1 to Nov 1, any sand sculptures or holes created on the beach need to be filled in and leveled before leaving the beach, do NOT leave any chairs or structures on beach after sunset.

### **PRESERVES AND PARKS:**

There are many parks and preserves set aside for enjoyment. Search for them online or on your phone. Most of these parks are open from Sunset to Sundown. Gates might be in place during non-operating hours.
